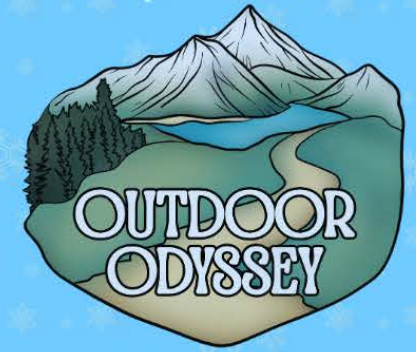

## Safety Instructions



- Check weather forecasts for temperature, wind, and snow conditions. Avoid outings in blizzards or below 0°F wind chill. Inform someone of your plans and return time.
- Dress in layers: Base layer (moisture-wicking), mid-layer (insulating), outer layer (waterproof). Wear waterproof boots, wool socks, gloves, hat, and gaiters. Use sunglasses/goggles for glare and sunscreen for reflection.
- Ensure snowshoes fit your weight/boot size (our website has weight capacity info). Test bindings/fit before starting. Use poles for balance (included in bundles).
- Walk with wider stance.
  - On flats: Natural stride.
  - Uphill: Lean forward, use crampons (metal spikes under snowshoes).
  - Downhill: Bend knees, heel-plant.
  - Traversing: Side-step. Use poles for rhythm/stability.
- Stick to marked trails. Avoid steep/icy areas if you're a beginner.
- For frozen lakes/ponds: Check ice thickness (4+ inches clear ice for individuals, 8-12+ for groups per Maine DIFW). Never go alone on ice.
- During use: Shake off snow. Avoid rocks/roots that could damage crampons. If binding loosens, stop and readjust.
- Stay hydrated. Eat snacks for energy.
- Watch for hypothermia/frostbite signs (shivering, numbness).
- Wildlife/Etiquette: Yield to skiers; stay off groomed trails. Pack out trash. Clean gear to prevent invasives (Bureau of Parks and Lands rule). Leash pets on allowed trails.

The safety instructions provided here serve as a baseline for a safe and enjoyable experience. Customers are responsible for complying with all applicable local, state, and federal laws, regulations, and rules, including those from the Maine Department of Inland Fisheries & Wildlife. Always check current conditions and obtain any required info or permits before heading out. Liability waiver required.
